- Low threshold housing for homeless individuals, Health Imperatives focus is on survivors of HT/CSE.

- No strict requirements related to abstinence or engagement in services

Pathways to Power

 A series of career development workshops, community building opportunities, oneon-one career coaching and mentorship to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking.





Clinical & Emergency Services A New Day SAFEPLAN

- Free & confidential services for survivors (and their non-offending loved ones) of sexual assault, sex trafficking or commercial sexual exploitation.
- Available in the immediate aftermath, years later, or any time in between.
- Counseling and advocacy support are available for individuals and groups.
- 24/7 advocacy support in the community to assist survivors with medical and police matters.
- Training and prevention groups for members of the community and providers.

- Free court and legal advocacy, as well as safety planning for survivors of domestic and sexual violence, and stalking to support application for restraining orders (209A) and harassment orders (258E) at Brockton District and Brockton Probate Courts.
- SAFEPLAN, a partnership between the Massachusetts Office for Victim Assistance (MOVA), the courts, and other criminal justice and social service agencies.





Clinical & Emergency Services

- Support group is for LGBTQ+ youth from ages 14 to 19.
- The group is run by youth and supported by adult mentors.
- Weekly meetings to provide peer support, opportunities for discussion, leadership development, health education, and recreational activities.
