We provide survivors with the support and information to keep themselves and their children safe. We **never require** a survivor to be leaving, or have left, a relationship to receive services.

All Safe Passage services are **free and confidential.**

The Safe Passage office and all services are accessible to people with disabilities.

Our staff are **bilingual in English and Spanish**, and we have translation services for other languages.

We are here for everyone.

Survivors with identities that experience marginalization face additional identity-based stigma and barriers to accessing services. In response, Safe Passage has Counselors and Advocates who specialize in providing specialized services to these priority populations.
