- Hospital based intimate partner violence program working with patients and employees of Brigham and Women's Hospital
- Sites at Brigham, Faulkner, Southern Jamaica Plain Health Center, Brookside Community Health Center
- Risk Assessment & Safety Planning
- Empowerment-based Supportive Counseling*
- **generally short-term, focusing on 1-2 goals, safety planning, availability during inpatient stay, referrals to community/health care partners for longer-term work*

- All bilingual services are free and voluntary

Adelante/Moving Forward with Hope Services

- Cross institutional program between Brigham and Women's Hospital and Beth Israel offering support to survivors of domestic and foreign labor and sex trafficking
- Open to both patients and community survivors who live in MA and are 18 years and older
- Case Management, Risk Assessment, Safety Planning & Empowerment-based Supportive Counseling
- Consultation: clinical determination if direct connection is helpful or consultation only is best
- All services are free, voluntary, and bilingual in Spanish as needed. Interpretation available for speakers of other languages.

Clinical Supervision for Violence Intervention and Prevention staff and community program interns

- Clinical supervision means providing support and intervention to those providing direct services to clients around situations that arise while working with clients or cases that may be clinically difficult.

- Provide clinical support to intern sited at the Family Justice Center
- On call clinical support for crisis cases
- MH Training for BWH collaborated sites and programs
- Short term therapy for clients in the Adelante and VRP program(future service to be provided)
