

UPCS-V Feedback Session for Housing Authorities, on April 28, in Washington, D.C.

In support of their continued effort to shape the Uniform Physical Condition Standards-Voucher (UPCS-V), HUD has invited NAHMA staff and seven (7) additional members to a feedback session currently scheduled for **April 28th 2016, from 1:00p.m. to 5:00p.m. at the HUD Headquarters Weaver Building, Suite A (Washington, D.C.)**. HUD is requesting feedback on a variety of topics related to UPCS-V which are listed in the attached agenda. In advance of the discussion, please find also attached a preliminary draft copy of the Dictionary of Definitions for UPCS-V.
