- Maintenance Supervisor: Oversees all maintenance operations for an apartment community
- Senior /Regional Maintenance Supervisor: Oversees maintenance and capital operations for a portfolio of communities
- Maintenance/Facilities Director, Director of Operations: Oversees all aspects of maintenance and capital operations for an entire organization
